



## The VLC Micro-Credential Courses

Micro-Credentials are short open online courses that differ from traditional degrees or certifications in that they focus on a narrower and more specialized subject, and that they can often be completed in a shorter amount of time. They aim at helping individuals acquire specific skills and knowledge in a particular field or area.

The VLC Micro-Credentials consist of 4 to 5 units (workload ca. 30 to 40 hours), they are supported by the custom chatbot OpenAl Help, they are certified and do not involve any fees. To find a micro-credential course on the VLC, type "MC" into the course search window on the VLC Home Page:
