Apart from some allophonic differences, the consonantal systems of the varieties of PDE are highly similar.

Rhoticity

- the post-vocalic "r" mother / 'mʌðə / * / 'mʌðər / here / hɪə / * / hɪər /
- the linking /r/ mother here + Vowel
- the intrusive /r/India __ {ə, a:, b: }# + Vowel





Exemplification
